

DEATH OF AN EMINENT LAWYER. SERJEANT PARRY PASSES AWAY IN HIS

SIXTY FIFTH YEAR-DEATH OF HIS WIFE FROM GRIEV. LONDON, Jan. 11.

PROM GRIEV. John Humffreys Parry, the eminent sorgent-at-law, is dead, aged 64. The death of Mrs. Parry from grief at the loss of her huaband is also an-nounced. [Sergeant Parry, who was the son of John Hamffreys Parry, barrister, and an eminent Welsh scholar, was born in London, Jan. 24th, 1816, and was edu-cated at the Philological School, Maryle-bone. In early life he was for a few years if a merchant's counting-house ; he after-words held an appointment in the Printed Book Department of the British Misseum ; was called to the bar June 9, 1843, and re-ceived the coif June 9, 1866, and a patient of procedence in 1964.
