The ice in the river this year is exceptionally thick, clear and
hard. It is estimated that this is about the toughest proposition this specially constructed ice-
breaker has ever faced. When launched in 1916 by Canadian
Vickers Company, Montreal, the vessel, then known as the John
D. Hazen, was sold outright to the Russian Government with view to keeping Archangel open
for the importation of war mater-
ial.
The Russian revolution made the ownership of the icebreaker matter of doubt and nothing was heard of her for two years. In quiries made eventually brought ship had been handed over to the French.
