BANK FISHERY.

The Bank fishery is the best man-aged part of our great industry, and even in that combination might be resorted to with advantage especially resorted to with advantage especially in the storage and supply of bait, and in the curing of the fish. Our methods of handling codfish require to be revised at almost every stage. It may be said that the fish fakes and stages throughout the Island are open to improvement. It should be remembered that codfish is intended for human food, and every precaution should be taken to protectit from contamination. Codfish should not be pressed into casks or drums not be pressed into casks or drums by any means, except by a power screw or press. In loading ves-sels with bulk fish, special boots or. slipers should be provided for the men at work in the vessel's hold.
