turb him."



That the firm did not exaggerate prevailing conditions is shown by other testimony. A man and wife were granted £2. 10s a week to relieve their poverty when the earnings of four single daughters brought the family income up to £7. 5s a week. So generous were the Guardians i disbursing the money of the taxpayers that they granted one deputation from the unemployed a higher scale of relief than had been asked for. In their own defense the Guardians simply state, in effect, that they were elected to help the poor people of the borough, and they have no excuses to offer for doing it.

THREE HUNDRED YEARS AT BOT-

Penetanguishene, Ont., June 14.-Buried beneath the waters of the River Wye for more than three hundred years, the long lost treasure box of the Jesuit Mission to Huronia has been located by the needle of a magnet divining rod. It lies beneath twenty feet of water and mud, and divers are now starting to raise it. Just what the hox will show when

t is brought to light is at present a matter of conjecture, but the needle shows that it contains gold in great

This finding further is verified by the records of the Society of Jesus, which show that one of the seven big boxes brought into New France in the year 1650 and laboriously carried to Fort Sainte Marie by canoe, was lost and never recovered. An examination of the records indicate that the box probably contains the altar candelabra and the pay-checks of the troops which accompanied the blackrobed missionaries into the wilderness of Huronia.
