great number of whom are Scotsmen. n various communities throughout China. Without them the Governnent, trade, or industry of the coun-

try could not endure. Unofficially, the Central and Provincial Governments are glad to seek advice from British diplomatic and onsular officials.

There are large concentrations of British in Hong-kong, Shanghai, Tientsin, and Peking, who are fairly well equipped to look after them-

In Canton, Swatow, Foochow, Amoy, Hankow, and at the Yangtse River ports there are smaller groups who are not so fortunately situated Britons are also scattered, sometimes singly and sometimes with their women-folk and children, throughout the interior of a vast country.

Banking and Commerce.

The docks and wharves of the great Treaty ports employ 200 Britons as supervisors, harbourmasters, and in other capacities to handle the merchandise of the 700 British firms established in China.

In every considerable town there are branches of British banking firms. All of these employ British managers

There are also several Englishmen employed by the English newspapers published in China.

Revenue from the maritime Customs, the salt tax, and the "likin," or internal Customs, is controlled by an international board, whose Inspector-General and many of whose other officials are British. By the nature of their work these men are compelled to live often in the most naccessible and lonely stations.

Expert Engineers.

The great coalfields, as yet almost untapped, are largely managed by British mining experts and engineers The railways that carry their produce o ports and distributing centres have been built with the help of British brains and capital.

## Locust's Natural **Enemy Discovered**

In the Argentine Republic locusts or grasshoppers, are so persistent a pest that the Government includes a special department for coping with their migrations. The most practicable method of giving battle to the locusts consists of driving them into sunken traps, where they are burned. Recently a natural enemy of the locust was found, a true insect which pursues them on the wing, depositing her eggs within the bodies of the swarming migrants. These eggs hatch into maggots which kill their engineers of the coasting and river hosts. When this happens the armies of locusts dwindle into scattered, straggling groups. 
