PROUDFOOT INQUIRES

Wants to Know Why Earnings Dropped to \$250,000-Reduction in the Rates.

[Special to The Advertiser.] Toronto, April 22.-Investigation into the management of the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Railway, in an effort to learn why the net earnings dropped as low as \$250,000 for the past year, was conducted by the Liberal party before the public accounts committee today, William Proudfoot being the chief questioner. The explanation of Secretary McGee was to the effect that the road was primarily a colonization line, intended to advance the cause of settlers first, and it was due to increases in salaries, together with a general reduction in freight rates, that the earnings sagged from the previous year's figures of \$454,-000. In many cases, he added, the rates on that line for the sending out of pulpwood and other settlers' products, is from half to two cents lower per hundred pounds than upon any other line. In many other instances the rates are lower, in some cases they are equal to the lowest quoted by the C. P. R., and in no case are they higher than upon other lines in any part of the Dominion. The roadbed, Mr. McGee contended,

was of the highest standard in Canada, as good as the G. P. T. with less trouble over grades. Were 700 Passes. "How many passes were issued over

this line during the year?" asked Mr. Proudfoot. "Very few, most of the passes were issued over the Dominion Railway Board." "How many annual passes, outside officials, were given over the whole Temiskaming system?"

"Deducting M. P. P.'s, I would say over seven hundred," replied Mr. Mc-Gee, "this includes ministers, secretaries and other Parliament building em-

"This includes the trip of the Liberal party," suggested Chairman Ferguson. "The Liberal party paid their own way, emember that," replied Mr. Proudfoot. Earnings from royalties on ore shipnents were less than the year previous, this being due to the fact that the percentage had been reduced.


