NO CHANGES MADE IN SALARY SCHEDULE BY UTILITIES BOARD

List Shows a Steady Reduction, Says Manager.

TESTING WATERWORKS

Trial To Be Made Before an Expert on Monday Next.

The salary schedule of the utilities commission was finally passed by the commission yesterday afternoon. There were no changes from the list published two weeks ago. It provides an increase of \$200 to General Manager E. V. Buchanan, his salary now being \$3,000; Secretary Ellwood, from \$2,200 to \$2,400; A. E. Carrothers, assistant secretary, from \$1,300 to \$1,400; C. H. Colby, \$1,250 to \$2,000; R. W. Swazie, \$250 to \$600; S. J. Dawson, \$500 to \$1,000; W. G. Bailey, \$500 to \$1,000; H. L. Hickson, \$750 to \$850; D. W. McEwen, \$750 to \$850; W. J. Paynter, \$1,020 to \$1,050; I. Freeland, \$540 to \$600; G. James, \$480 to \$550; W. J. Alford, \$1,440 to \$1,500; W. J. Jackson, \$1,250 to \$1,350; C. L. Griffin, \$1,020 to \$1,200; W. E. Browne, \$600 to \$650; A. McEwen, \$624 to \$875; T. P. Johnston, \$840 to \$900; R. McCormick, \$1,250 to \$1,280; G. Allen, \$480 to \$540.

The salaries not changed were: J. A. Nichols \$810, A. C. Stalk \$900, R. M. Simmie \$600, H. C. Perry \$750, A. O. Hunt \$2,400, G. McFadden \$1,020, W. McKeough \$750, Roy Stevens \$720, F. Grove \$900, E. R. Atkins \$900, H. A. Plaster \$900, D. C. Platt \$750, W. H. Payne \$750, George Sumner \$480, H. McCann \$600, T. K. Hodgkinson \$1,440, H. Ashplant \$600.

Schedule Reasonable. General Manager Buchanan stated that in 1914 there were 43 employees, with a salary list of \$44,839; in 1915, 49 employees, with a salary list of \$40,506, while this year there were 33 employees, costing \$38,555. He thought the schedule reasonable.

The resignation of Geo. R. Tambling, assistant secretary, was accepted. A letter of appreciation of his long services will be given him.

Another test of the waterworks system will be made by R. O. Wynne-Roberts on Monday next. An effort will be made to have a more satisfactory showing.

It was decided to purchase three transformers from the Maloney Company, Windsor, costing \$4,430.

A number of patriotic associations, etc., made applications for material, and the commission decided to draw the line. A cash deposit will be asked from all those who want to borrow materials.

The Victor Amusement Company paid \$100 for the privilege of having a driveway from Springbank Park to their amusement grounds.

The legislation committee of the city council decided to ask the attorney-general's department whether or not the city could pass a bylaw to enforce zones of quiet in London, and a bylaw to compel auto owners to use searchlights on their machines to use dimmers. The committee at the meeting yesterday afternoon was not clear on the situation.

It was reported that no interview had been arranged with the City Gas Company relative to a low rate for manufacturers.
