

UNIVERSITY GRADUATES ITS LARGEST CLASS TODAY

Largest Graduation Class In History of Western Receive Degrees Tonight

Ninety-Two Graduates of University of Western Ontario Gather at Majestic Theatre For Convocation—Hon. William Rogers To Deliver Address.

FOUR MARRIED WOMEN GET DIPLOMAS

With all the impressiveness that usually marks such events, degrees will be conferred upon 92 graduates of the University of Western Ontario at the convocation which is to be held at the Majestic Theatre tonight.

The convocation procession will form up at the Y. M. C. A. building on Wellington street, at 7:30 o'clock. Headed by Dr. Slack and Dr. Wallace Crawford and followed by members of the faculty, Hon. Dr. Roche, chancellor of the university, and Hon. William F. Roberts, minister of New Brunswick, who is to deliver the convocation address, the marchers will proceed to the Majestic Theatre where the presentation of degrees and prizes will take place.

The feature of the evening will be the address to be delivered by Hon. William Rogers. This will be followed by the conferring of degrees, presentation of prizes, medals and

scholarships to the largest number of graduates ever recorded in the history of the University of Western Ontario. Out of a total of 94 students, only two failed to secure their degrees, a record which will be hard to surpass in future years.

Among the graduates are four married women, who have successfully passed the examinations in arts, and will tonight receive the degrees which allow them to write B. A. after their names. They are Mrs. J. E. Kerrigan, Mrs. G. D. Rowell, Mrs. G. D. Rowell, and Mrs. E. W. Grange. Miss Winnifred Guinan, winner of the governor-general's medal for general proficiency, is a graduate of Brescia Hall, and will also receive the degree of Bachelor of Arts.

Altogether degrees are being awarded in medicine, arts and the ministry to graduates of Huron College, Assumption College, Sandwich, Brescia Hall, University College and the School of Medicine.

WESTERN UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION RESULTS

Examination results, medal, scholarship and prizewinners for the University of Western Ontario have been announced.

With the announcement comes a statement from Dr. K. P. R. Neville, registrar of the university, that all records for the various colleges, both as to the percentage of successful candidates and high marks obtained, were broken by the students of 1923.

In a class of 32 students striving for degrees, only two were unsuccessful. This splendid showing, he said, was but an indication of the results obtained throughout the various years. Regarding the marks obtained, he stated that some of the medal winners obtained as high as 96 per cent, establishing a record for the school.

Miss Winnifred Guinan of 555 Wellington street won premier honors by capturing the much-coveted award of the governor-general's medal for proficiency in the general course in the fourth year. Miss Guinan is quite accustomed to honors, however, for she won the general proficiency prize in her junior year and in her sophomore year the prize for Latin.

Miss Helen Hardy of 611 Oxford street won the general proficiency scholarship in the third year. Miss Hardy is a member of the Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society and won the general proficiency prize for general proficiency in the third year.

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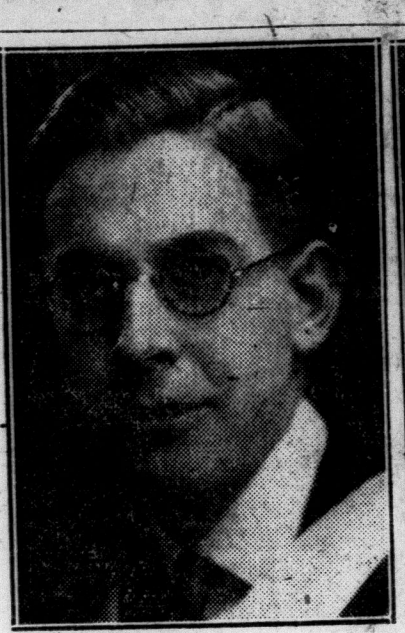
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C. A. WRIGHT,
