Revolt in the Salvation Army.

SALVATIONISTS DECLARE THAT BALLENGOON SHOULD NOT LEAVE—TALK OF A SUCCESSION.
New York, January 28.—The preliminary order relieving Ballengoon of the command of the Salvation Army in America has called forth a protest from the 20,000 officers who fairly worship the commander and his wife. The army was stunned by the news. It asked for an explanation, a reason why its leader should be taken away. He answered sadly that he knew nothing more than what the brief order contained. Not a word of information accompanied it. There was no news of where he was to go or who would be his successor.

Venezuelan Commission.

ITS FIRST FORMAL BUSINESS SESSION HELD FRIDAY—MAKING EXCELLENT PROGRESS.
Washington, Jan. 25.—The Venezuelan commission, which was organized here last business session here yesterday. The commission has, no doubt, no evidence sufficient to support the allegations made in the forthcoming. The commission has directed that a survey be made of the territory to furnish all information bearing on the question now in its archives. Director Walcott of the geological survey, and Marcus Baker, chief geographical expert of the government have explained to the commission elaborate maps of the physical conditions of Venezuela and the northern part of South America, upon which a survey has been engaged the past two days. The commission adjourned until next Friday. Justice Brewer said that the commission was making excellent progress.
