Ecumenical Conference Echoes.—President A. H. Strong, D. D., Rochester Theological Seminary struck its keynote in his address on "The Authority and Purpose of Foreign Missions." "In what," he asked, "does that authority consist? I answer: Christ. What is the purpose of Foreign Missions? Still I answer: Christ For Christ is Christianity and Christianity is Christ."
