Game played by two members of the Montreal Chess Club 17th October, 1879, at the odds of a Knight.

(Gloucester Place.)

Remove White's Queen, a Knight.

White.—(Mr. John Barry.) Black.—(Mr. G. B.)

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Black should have taken White's Knight with his King.

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Black's best course was now to play Rook to Rook's square; after the move made, his game is irretrievably lost.

The concluding moves are finally played by White, and result in a brilliant mate.

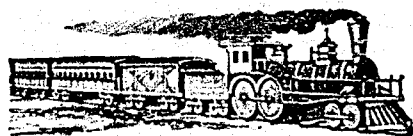
