There is a fair enquiry for nearly all descriptions of bacon, the low prices ruling having caused a good consumptive demand. Hams are in good request and sell readily. Shoulders are scarce and wanted. There is more activity in lard, the week's sales amounting to 250 tons.

Cheese is dearer, and the fine qualities are readily saleable at firm prices. Stocks are unusually light.


