PROPOSED SALE OF CABLEVISION INTEREST IN CANADA
—DISCUSSION BETWEEN FEDERAL AND
PROVINCIAL MINISTERS

Mr. Roch La Salle (Joliette): Mr. Speaker, I have a supplementary question for the Secretary of State.

With regard to the proposal which the Quebec government, through the General Investment Corporation and several companies, must make to the CRTC on June 28, would the minister indicate whether he has discussed this particular question with his Quebec counterpart and if not, is he in a position to say that the federal government does not object to this project?

Hon. Gérard Pelletier (Secretary of State): Mr. Speaker, my Quebec counterpart has asked me not to reveal the specific questions which we discussed this morning. He wants our conversations to remain confidential until they are brought to an end. I would simply indicate that according to the terms of the transactions in question, if we are talking about the same ones, no controlling interests of a provincial agency are involved, and as far as I know, the provincial agency will not file an application with the CRTC at the end of the month, but I repeat that this is only from what I know about the project.
