

XXI.

Powers of Council—Regulations.

The Council shall have full power in all other respects to regulate and conduct all the undertakings and affairs whatsoever of the Association,—and to that end to promulgate and enforce all such Regulations, whether general or special, not being inconsistent with any By-Law thereof, as they may see fit to ordain, and may amend all such Regulations at pleasure; but all such Regulations and all Amendments thereof, shall be laid before the Association, at latest, at the Annual Meeting thereof, next after their promulgation, and if disallowed by the Association, shall thereupon become and be null and void. But such annulling shall not destroy the validity or effect of anything previously done in good faith under such Regulation.

XXII.

Property to be Insured.

It shall be the duty of the Council to keep all buildings, works of art, books, and other property, belonging to the Association, and also all property entrusted to it, at all times fully insured against loss by fire; and in their Annual Report, to be submitted at every Annual Meeting of the Association, to state in full detail all their doings whatsoever in respect of such insurance.
