SEVEN WATER SPOUTS SIGHTED FROM BRIDGE

Steamer Virginia From Kingston, Jamaica, For New York, Battered by Wind and Rain.

New York, April 6.—With seven of her crew more or less injured and the others utterly exhausted, the steamer Virginia arrived here to-day from Kingston, Jamaica, after a desperate struggle with a storm of sixty hours' duration off Hatteras.

The wind reached a velocity of sixty miles an hour and rain fell in torrents. At one time seven water spouts were sighted from the steamer's bridge. An immense wave, which struck the ship about six hours after she had run into the storm, ripped off the tarpaulins that had been hastily battened down over the hatch openings, which had been left open to give ventilation to the cargo of bananas from the companies, cabin and scuppers were flooded four feet deep, the rush of water extinguishing the galley fires.

Several of the mess-room and cabin force were more or less seriously injured. During the sixty hours which the storm continued, Capt. G. H. Barber, who remained continuously on the bridge and every man of the crew was kept at his post.

The doctor says the waters contained the products of coal tar, and provided no nourishment because they were taken on an empty stomach.

END AT LAST IN SIGHT OF LONG THAW TRIAL Case Will Probably Go to Jury on Thursday—Last Witness To-Day.

New York, April 6.—That the long-drawn-out Thaw trial, now in its seventh week, will be finished this coming week now seems almost certain.

There is no sign of any more delays, which have marked the case from the beginning, although those who have followed the trial closely have been disappointed so often about its close that they are chary about predicting anything in regard to it.

Dr. Allan McLane Hamilton, the alienist, who was on the stand when the case was suddenly stopped by the district attorney's suggestion that the appointment of a commission in lunacy would be advisable, will probably be recalled to the stand when the trial resumed on Monday.

He has already testified that he believes Thaw was insane when he shot Stanford White, and he will probably repeat that statement.

Now Safe. The lunacy commission, having decided that Thaw is now sane, Mr. Jerome will probably be prevented from asking Dr. Hamilton about his opinion of Thaw's present sanity.

Therefore, there is little upon which he can cross-examine the alienist.

Whether or not the defence will call any more witnesses is a question that is said that they expect to require, if more than one hour to complete their case.

Under the legal procedure of the courts of New York, evidence in defence ends the case. The only way in which the prosecution can get evidence is by a special agreement between the court on the grounds that the evidence is necessary, or that the witnesses were not in the jurisdiction of the court when the prosecution was submitting its direct case.

It had been rumored that the witnesses would attempt to put several new witnesses upon the stand after the final close of the case, but his statement to-night puts that rumor to rest.

Some weeks ago, at one of the many times when the case seemed nearing its close, it was agreed between the leading attorneys that each one should have a full day for his summing up; that the crime was planned and premeditated, and that he should suffer the extreme penalty of the law.

While Mr. Jerome conscientiously believes that Thaw is insane to-day, he should be confined in some institution where he could not be a menace to the community, the commission has decided that he is not, and there is nothing for the district attorney to do but to demand that Thaw be sent to the electric chair.

Gave Thaw Free Scope. In speaking of the action of the lunacy commission, one of the attorneys said that physical examination of Thaw, Clifford
