INTERFERENCE WITH CABLES.

He Would Not Deny the Right to Cut Them. London, April 26.-Mr. Balfour, replying ions on the subject, said he had reason o believe the Spanish Government Intended to limit themselves to the acquirement of auxiliary cruisers, like those proposed to be employed by Germany in 1870. Respecting interference with cables, he pointed out that article 15 of the Paris Convention of 1884, to which Great Britain, Spain and the United States were parties, provided that belligerents in time of war were free to act with regard to cables as if the convention did not exist.
