LOCAL NEWS

Tenders have been called for the construction of a wooden warehouse on berth sixteen, West St. John.

Rev. Ralph Haughton preached his farewell sermon in the Congregational church last evening. Mr. Haughton will leave in a few days for Montreal and in Ontario cities where he will preach. Mr. Haughton has not yet accepted a call.

The 'Prentice Boys' marched to the Tabernacle Baptist church yesterday morning, where the pastor, Rev. Frederick Dennison, preached. The three lodges taking part were the King Edward, No. 30, Maple Leaf, No. 40, and Union Jack, No. 35.

Private Fred L. Tibbetts, a member of No. 8 Ambulance Corps, was shot but not seriously wounded by a bullet thrown from the hand of a fifteen-year-old boy at the army in Carmichael street on Sunday morning. The boy was placed under arrest but was allowed to go home with his parents.

Yesterday was observed as rally day by the Presbyterian Sunday school throughout the dominion and the local churches carried out the programme suggested by the General Assembly. Holy services were held also in Ludlow street and Tabernacle Baptist churches, the Exmouth street Methodist and Douglas avenue Christian church Sunday schools.

BURIED YESTERDAY
The funeral of James Percy Magee took place yesterday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock from his late residence, 60 Exmouth street, services being conducted at the home by Rev. W. G. Lane. Interment was made at Fernhill cemetery.

The late Mr. Magee was a member of No. 2 Hose Company and the members of the fire department attended the funeral in a body as a final tribute of respect. Since his death flags were flown half staff above the fire stations and other public buildings. The City Cornet Band was also present making the ceremony a most impressive one. There were numerous floral tributes.

MILLIONS OF MEN ARE SHELTERED

London Times Says Exemptions Must be Removed
1,600,000 Have Badges

Must Prepare as if Estimate of German Forces Was Most Unfavorable to the Entente Allies

London, Sept. 25.—The Times military correspondent, discussing the supply of men for the army and the need for enrolment of men of military age, who are escaping service, says:

"However satisfied we may be with the losses and defeats we have inflicted upon the enemy this year, we have no right to entertain any more illusions on the subject of German power. In making our estimate of strength for the next year we must take for our basis the calculation of the German strength which is unfavorable to us. We know that the number of German divisions in the field, and we must assume they are or can be brought up to strength. We must still admit large reserves behind them. The sweep into German factories and farms of able-bodied men and women in Belgium and in the nine provinces of France occupied by the enemy, combined with the utilization of Poles for military purposes, will produce a large accession of strength for the German armies. The 1917 and 1918 classes of recruits in Germany have not yet taken the field. There is a constant inflow to the front of wounded who have recovered. Lastly, must admit as possible that before Germany accepts defeat she will call on all youths and men fit for arms between the ages of 16 and 60, and so all youth to wear us out by a long phase of victorious resistance.
