London Times Says Exemptions Must be Removed

1,600,000 Have Badges

Must Prepare as if Estimate of German Forces Was Most Unfavorable to the Entente Allies

London, Sept. 25 .- The Times military correspondent, discussing the supply of men for the army and the need for encolment of men of military age, who are caping service, says:

"However satisfied we may be with the losses and defeats we have inflicted upon the enemy this year, we have no right to entertain any more illusions on the subject of German power. In making our estimate of strength for the next year we must take for our basis the calculation of the German strength which is unfavorable for us. We know the number of German divisions in the field, and we must assume they are or can be brought up to strength. We must still admit large reserves behind them.
