REMARKS.

It will be difficult to continue holding service once a fortnight at Thorne Centre and North Clarendon, unless more can be raised. Several in North Clarendon have not yet paid anything, and two or three at Thorne Centre. There is no glebe here, but horse feed was furnished last winter chiefly by Thorne, in part by the other places. Many have done well in this respect. If the people had ever made the proper effort they could have secured land for the pasture of a horse and cow, and fenced it so as to keep the cattle of the surrounding country out of it.

It will be seen by the report that Leslie congregation has given about as much as the other three in money; and Thorne Parsonage, besides hay and oats, more than North Clarendon and Thorne Centre together. A clergyman will find it impossible to live here except some effort is made to raise all the salary expected from the place.
