SEOUL, Korea, June 10-Three hundred persons have been arrested, after minor riots at the elaborate funeral ceremonies of Yi, ex-Emperor of Korea. Students created an uproar by shouting "Success to Korean independence," when 100,000 people gathered on a mountain-top at dawn yesterday in the funeral ceremonies.

Revolutionary pamphlets were being distributed by the students when the police intervened, making wholesale arrests. The funeral itself was picturesque, and the funeral proceession was one of the greatest the world has





WINNIPEG, Man., June 10—The Dominion Council of the Navy League of Canada has passed a resolution stating that in the opinion of the council it was the duty of the people of Canada to provide adequate naval protection to the sea-borne com-

merce of the Dominion.

The resolution stated that such protection should be on the basis of due proportion to the volume of sea-borne trade and in agreement with other parts of the Empire and that the safety of the Dominion required that consideration of such naval needs cannot further be postponed.
