BRITANNIA FAMOUS YACHT. Retirement of Royal Craft Recalls Races for Bennett Cups.

(New York Times.) The recent announcement from Lon-don that King George would not race the royal yacht Britannia next season, the British ruler feeling that it would be unbecoming of him to spend money season last evening. Britannie has never been in American waters, but American yachts—especially in that brilliant season of 1893—raced against her in the Solent. Britannia was once winner of the Cone May Challenge Cup, offered for cemptition by yachts of all nations by the lat. Commoder James Gordon Bennett; and she lost the Branton Reef Cup, also a Bennett trophy. Both cups are for ocean races.

Britannia is a keel vessel of 115 net tons, 124 feet over all, and with a water-line length of eighty-seven feet. She might now be regarded as a triffe wide of the property of the property to the property of the property

inches of width. She has a draught of succession of eight yachts owned by the late King Edward VII. who, as Prince of Wales, was an indefatigable yachtsman.

The roce in which Britannia lost the Brenton Reef Cup was sailed on Sept. 12, 1893, over a course from off the Needles Rocks, arounds Cherbourg breakwater, and hock to the Needles, approximately 120 nautical miles. The Brenton Reef and the Cape May Cups had been brought to England in 1885 by Genesta Sir Richard Sutton's fleet.
