ANCESTOR OF THE PRUNE ARISTOCRACY

Wilmington, Del., Dec. 10.—The "perfect prune" is soon to be grown in the United States, Prof. L. R. Detjen of Delaware College, announced in an address before the 34th annual convention of the Peninsula Horticultural Society. Describing his super-prune, which is to be evolved from a domestic plum, Prof. Detjen said it would be the first time an American variety has been adapted to prune purposes, the output hitherto having been grown from European varieties. Prof. Detjen explained that his plum is carefully bred until it becomes the ancestor of a United States prune aristocracy which, he said, will be the breeding source for a new and hardier race of prunes for Eastern America.

AUSTRALIA'S WHEAT CROP. Melbourne, Australia, Dec. 10.—(By Canadian Press)—It is estimated by the Australian Wheat Board that 5,000,000 bushels of wheat will be available for export before the next harvest. The acreage under wheat this year is 11,552,000, which nearly constitutes a record having been exceeded only once, in 1915-1916. The outlook for the coming crop is considered exceedingly favorable.

MRS. MACSWINEY TELLS HER STORY. Recounts Tale of Husband's Arrest and Death Before Commission in Washington.

Washington, Dec. 9.—The life story of the late Terence MacSwiney, lord mayor of Cork, was told today by his widow to the commissioner of the "Committee of One Hundred" an organization promoted for investigating the Irish question. Applause and sobs marked her recital.

Mrs. MacSwiney told of her marriage to the late lord mayor in England in 1907, after her husband had been released from one of several prison terms. She said her only boy was named Terence, after his father who was in jail in Belfast. Mrs. MacSwiney recounted the arrest, on August 12, 1920, and beginning of the late hunger strike. Her husband, she said, was charged with having a code with the police, and she said she was spread propaganda to the effect that relatives of the lord mayor were secretly providing him with food.
