In these Forms works are read with a view to the Honour and Scholarship Examinations at the Universities. The authors in Greek, Latin, French, German, and English, are changed from year to year in order to suit the varying capabilities or requirements of pupils.

Writing and Drawing are taught throughout the School; the most approved copy-books are provided for the former, and a great variety of models for the latter.
