

Q.64 And on that particular date, the Twenty-Seventh of February,

A.68 No sir.

Q.69 Now about the dates?
A.69 No sir.

Q.70 Now you say you handed Captain Jessop Four Hundred Guilders
in his room that morning and at the same time you say you
got a pass to go to Gronigen for the weekend. Is that
correct?
A.70 I never received it at his room sir.

Q.71 Where did you receive that pass?
A.71 At B squadron orderly room sir.

Q.72 Who signed that pass, the one you received from B squadron
orderly room?
A.72 I don't know who gave it to me sir and I don't know who
signed it.

Q.73 You don't know who signed it?
A.73 No sir.

Q.74 It was a pass to go to Gronigen, was it?
A.74 Yes sir.

Q.75 And you don't recall the signature on it?
A.75 No sir.

Q.76 You never turned it in, did you?
A.76 This particular pass, I did, sir.

Q.77 But on many and many occasions you went to Gronigen and all
over the country and you never turned your pass in when you
got back. Is that correct?
A.77 Yes sir.

Q.78 Now, if you were going to Gronigen on that particular weekend
you must have had a lot of Guilders in your pocket.
A.78 No sir.

Q.79 Did you have any Guilders in your pocket?
A.79 No sir.

Q.80 You went to Gronigen without any Guilders?
A.80 Yes sir.

Q.81 Yet Captain Jessop had Guilders, didn't he?
A.81 Yes sir.

Q.82 And he had them in his hand?
A.82 Yes sir.
