IRISH AFFAIRS.

LONDON, Jan. 26.—A deputation of loyalists from Ulster today walked on the streets of London, headed by the Rev. Dr. McManis, secretary under Gladstone.

They pointed out that in Ireland the legal power of the Queen's writ does not run outside of Ulster and that they would not be bound by any law existing in the south and west of Ireland.

They also pointed out that the Queen's writ does not extend to Ulster unless it is checked. The majority advised the deputation to do their utmost to enlist the sympathy of the English people in their cause.

LONDON, Jan. 27.—It is learned from official sources that W. H. Smith, now secretary of state for war, will be appointed chief secretary for Ireland.

It is stated that the Earl of Carnarvon will go to the colonies office, while Col. F. A. Stanley, at present secretary for the colonies, will be made secretary.

A meeting of nationalists met at the residence of Col. F. A. Stanley, at present secretary for the colonies, at 10, Downing street, on Friday evening.

The debate in the commons yesterday left the impression that both parties are anxious to conciliate the Parnellites and have no desire to enforce strong coercive measures.

At the same time it is believed that there is no chance of either conservatives or liberals proposing at this session any home rule measure likely to satisfy the Irish.

Mr. Gladstone said that the government is seeking re-election he was mainly guided by a wish to proceed with proposals for home rule.

Only the government, however, was able to do so, did not intend to introduce proposals of his own, but he would reserve his opinion.

He would not say whether he intended to alter or to add to proposals embodied in his election manifesto.

He pleaded the necessity of the opinions of the Irish nationalists.

Mr. Michael Hicks Beach said it was beyond dispute that the Irish had increased in Ireland. The new chief secretary for Ireland would consider the question whether the special powers were sufficient or whether special powers would be needed to suppress rioting.

Mr. Parnell said that he had always believed that if the principle were admitted that Ireland was entitled to some form of self-government, the settlement of details would not be found a formidable task.

He said that he believed that there would be no great difficulty in securing the consent of the British government to the present proposal.

Lord Salisbury, in the house of lords, and Mr. Hennessy, in the commons, will move that the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland be empowered to suspend the operation of the laws of the United Kingdom in Ireland.

The Daily Telegraph says that the government intend to seek the house of commons for the whole time of the present session.

The discussion of the proposed new rules of procedure will stand or fall by the result.

NEW YORK, Jan. 24.—The Herald's cable despatch, signed "a member of parliament," says the first two days of the parliamentary session would disclose the position of the various political parties on the Irish question.

The ministers are lampooned by the press of many of their followers and by the continued demands of a large section of the press for the adoption of more drastic measures in Ireland.

It is stated that the government is hesitating to propose new concessions. Turn which they will defend is inevitable. The Queen's speech and Lord Randolph Churchill's concluding remarks on Friday convince the home rulers that the government did not mean to bid for their votes.

This time they came back on Gladstone, who has fully made up his mind to all on the treasury bench before the Easter recess.

He lost no time in making overtures, endeavoring to calm fears in England on the one hand and on the other he announced the home rulers in vulgar but intelligible language that his mind was made up to have their support at the price fixed.

Parnell and followers listened with the deepest interest and repeated almost exclusively to them. The home rulers were naturally frightened, but not too much so.

Before the night debate had closed everybody could see that Gladstone once more had the Irish vote in his pocket and could be prime minister whenever he chose to do so.
