SHOULD TRY WOMEN IN SPECIAL COURT

Hindrances to the Reformation of the Outcast—Yellow Journalism a Bane.

CHICAGO, Sept. 22.—Yellow journalism was emphasized as one of the greatest menaces to the reformation of outcast women in an address made today by Mrs. Emma O'Sullivan, of Toronto, before the Prison Association of America, in session at the Auditorium Hotel.

The different processes through which a woman has to pass seem calculated to tear away the last shred of her self-respect, said Mrs. O'Sullivan.

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
