The Coal Output For New Brunswick

Canadian Bureau of Statistics Says Output for 1917 Was 189,668 Tons — Minto Field is Most Important in the Development.

The Canadian Bureau of Statistics says that the coal fields of New Brunswick have been known for many years but that they have not been developed to any great extent until within the last few years. The seams of coal are thin, not exceeding 22 inches in thickness, and in many places barely reaching 22 inches, but they lie in very close proximity to the surface. From the economic point of view the Minto field is the most important, and is the field which is at present being most extensively worked.

The Conditions At Marsh Bridge

City Engineer Says as Far as Sewerage is Concerned it is Matter for Board of Health to Deal With—Health Officer Suggests Survey be Made.

The report of G. G. Hare, city engineer, on the conditions at the Marsh Bridge so far as sewerage is concerned and he expresses the opinion that this is a matter for the Board of Health to deal with rather than the city council or department of water and sewerage.

"If the nuisance is caused by the sewers discharging at the Marsh bridge, which we do not admit or believe, I am of opinion that it would not help matters to permit a greater inflow of water at high tide. Any floating matter would be carried up-stream and distributed over a wider area and the condition aggravated."

"At present the tide flushes the area freely, water passes slowly inward through the gates of the abutment, causing no heavy current to carry floating matter up-stream, and with the turn of the tide everything is carried out."

The attention of Dr. J. F. L. Brown, district health officer, was called to the above report last night by The Standard and that official said he thought it would only be fair to accede to the suggestion of Mr. Hare and have a survey made of the section complained of before going any further into the matter and this would be done immediately. In connection with the paragraph about damps, Dr. Brown said these did come under the Board of Health and he presumed the chief inspector would have a report to make on this phase of the matter at the meeting of the board, which would be held on Tuesday next, as at the last meeting he was instructed to put into force all the regulations of the board, one of which required all persons operating a dump to have a permit to do so.
