## CABINET COLLEAGUES AND

## CITIZENS TENDER BANQUET

## TO HON. MINISTER OF MARINE

Besides Being Testimonial of Admiration and Respect to Mr. Lapointe It Was Also An Occasion for Celebration of Premier King's Victory—Premier in Speech Reviewed Political Situation from Liberal Standpoint.

Quebec, Feb. 21.—Fellow citizens and cabinet colleagues tendered Hon. Lapointe, Minister of Marine, a banquet at the Chateau Frontenac here tonight. The speakers beside the guest of the evening, were Federal Prime Minister, Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King; Hon. Jacques Bouché, Minister of Customs and Excise; Hon. Dr. Beland, Minister of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, and Premier of Quebec.

The banquet, besides being a testimony of admiration and respect for Mr. Lapointe, was also a celebration of the victory of Premier King and party in the recent Federal elections. Quebec, Feb. 21.—Premier Mackenzie King declared the occasion was one of exceptional rejoicing to the Liberals of all Canada, for they were celebrating the victory of Dec. 6 and especially the part played by the Liberals of Quebec Province in achieving that victory. They were there to affirm their resolve to take up the work of Government in Canada where Laurier left it in 1911, forgetting the differences and divisions and remembering only the heroisms and the sacrifices of the intervening period, to strive in the spirit of his example, with unity towards none and goodwill towards all to restore the days of a prosperous, contented and united Canada.

In Mr. Lapointe, Quebec had a worthy successor of Sir Wilfrid Laurier. If they accepted a policy of peace and reconciliation, that was one for redoubling for all Canada, for if there was one thing above another of which the people had had enough, it was the late administration of the late Prime Minister that the extermination was the act of a single Province. In six out of nine of the Provinces the parliamentary following of the late Prime Minister was obliterated as completely as in the Province of Quebec. This should silence forever the sinister imputation that with Quebec the motive was one of revenge. It was not the motive of Quebec, no also must it be the actuating motive in Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba. It was not revenge, it was the restoration of political rights that was sought at the polls. If political contests ever afforded an example of a nation, by constitutional means, divesting itself of a yoke, unconstitutionally imposed by unconstitutional rulers, it was the result as recorded on that day.

Exposed Pretense.  
The election itself was the unmasking of a vast pretense. It was obvious the country had a right to expect from the new administration the restoration of those rights which, in recent years, the people had felt themselves denied. This meant a return to representative and responsible Government in spirit as well as in name. He placed above all else the supremacy of Parliament and the recognition of the cabinet as a committee of Parliament, responsible to Parliament and through Parliament to the people. The House of Commons, recently dissolved, was a selected rather than an elected body, and on the Government side it had the most subservient following that had ever assembled in a Federal Parliament. Whenever it was not occupied in considering amendments to hastily and ill-devised legislation of previous sessions, it was being employed night and day in hurrying through, with as little opportunity of discussion as possible, measures of far-reaching importance and appropriations of public monies running into hundreds of millions of dollars. ## At Canadian Club

Late Officer of Indian Medical Service Spoke on "Recent Constitutional Developments in India."

"Recent Constitutional Developments in India," was the subject of an address delivered by Col. E. J. Sunder, late of the Indian Medical Service, before the Canadian Club assembled at luncheon at Bond's last evening.

In view of the present unrest and very critical situation existing in India today, the speaker attracted a most timely one and commanded great attention.

Doctor Sunder who spent some thirty years of his life in India and was thus versed with the conditions prevailing there, attributed much of the trouble to the overbearing and arrogant treatment of the natives by the Anglo-Indians. British rule, he said, was far from being just, and had it not been for it India today would still be plunged in almost the same undeveloped state in which it was when the East India Company established its first posts there, and that the country would be plunged into continual strife, through the warring of wars by the numerous small native kingdoms, one against the other.

Under British rule, however, law and order had been established, and the power of savorious landowners and tyrannical rajahs restrained by the strong hand of the Viceroy of India and his government.

Banks had been established, roads constructed, and railways built, and trade so encouraged that the country had made great strides. The railway system of India, Col. Sunder said, totalled over a thousand miles, owned by the government but placed under company control, two-sevenths of the profits of operation being turned over to the government revenue.

In referring to the great Indian leader of the day, Gandhi, the speaker said he was a fanatic, "he possessed great control over the masses in India. His doctrine was the boycotting of all things European, and would not countenance violence, as the shedding of blood was against the tenets of his faith."

Col. Sunder was of the opinion that wide heads and cool counsel would prevail in India, which with the sympathetic handling of the situation by the authorities, would overcome the difficulties of the day and serve but to strengthen as never before the ties of attachment between the Indian Empire and the Mother Country.

## U. S. Refuses To Abide

## By Agreements

Paris, Feb. 21.—French aviation circles are expressing astonishment at the United States' definite refusal to adhere to the international aviation convention. The question came up at an aviation conference at Monaco recently but a definite reply has been only lately received to the effect that the United States cannot adhere to the international convention about aerial navigation because this convention is the result of the activity of the League of Nations.

It appears the convention was signed Oct. 10, 1919, by twelve Powers of which the United States was one of five accorded preferential standing.

Of public concern of which the people's representatives in Parliament were justly entitled to first knowledge. One of the many troubles of the late administration was that most of its acts were done in the wrong way, at the wrong time in the wrong place. Instead of legislating in the open, on the floor of Parliament, the significant parts of the most important enactments of which Parliament was expected to express approval, not infrequently took the form of edicts already drafted in the secrecy of the Council Chamber and proclaimed an order-in-council. "Members of Parliament were daily denied the information they were entitled to seek, while the Press of the country was surfeited with accounts of the Government's doings as a part of perpetual propaganda, in which members of the Government and the Press were playing continually into each other's hands, not also, into each other's pockets."

Adopting the principle that Parliament was the place to make known the Government's policy, the Premier declared that this must be his apology for not attempting to satisfy public curiosity by any pronouncement of Government policy on the important subjects to be discussed in the approaching session.

Asks For Patience  
He had only one request to make, that the public and members of Parliament would give due consideration to the very limited time which members of the new administration had to familiarize themselves with the important matters demanding attention. "If the problems with which we are confronted," concluded the Premier, "are to be successfully solved the Government must resolutely refuse to be sidetracked, or precipitated into any course of action of which there has not been opportunity for mature consideration or deliberation. We are paying the price today for just that kind of behaviour, the hasty enactment of ill-considered and ill-digested legislation, some of which has placed a burden upon the country which it will have to carry through the years to come. We seek no unnecessary delay. All that we ask is that we be not obliged to take any step which may occasion our having to go too far on a road along which it may be difficult to return. Our aim is a united, a prosperous and a contented Canada, that which has been denied to us in the past, reconciliation not re-organization will be our program."

## Chief Inspector

John B. Hawthorne Takes Exception to Remarks Made by Clergyman and Says Act Is Enforced.

While in the city a short time yesterday, John B. Hawthorne, Chief Liquor Inspector, took occasion to comment highly on some extravagant remarks made by a pulpit orator of this city Sunday. The Chief Inspector or remarks any imputation, from any source, that the Prohibitory enforcement is lax in this province. He has an unbounded faith in his deputies, and personally keeps in close touch with every part of the province, and knows that conditions are as near ideal as the honest, conscientious work on the part of officials can make them.

Chief Hawthorne gave a few court statistics to substantiate his claim that there was much less drunkenness during 1921, the first year of his regime, than in 1920, the last year of his predecessor's office.

In the City of Montreal there were 200 less arrests in 1921 than in 1920 for drunkenness.

In St. John the arrests for 1920 were 253, and in 1921, 591. At Chatham there were 64 arrests in 1920, and only 21 in 1921. Other court records, he says, will show a corresponding decrease.

This is proof positive, thinks the Chief, that his official staff is doing its duty and by its activity has been able to keep down the sale of liquor at least one half as compared with the year 1920.

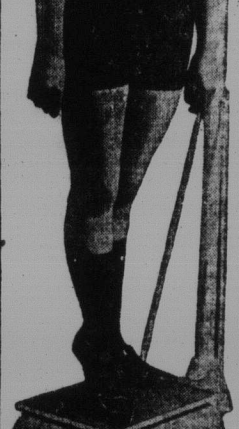
