We, therefore, the Elders and Licenciates of the Fr e Christian Baptist Conference of New Brunswick do hereby agree to the following Constitution for an Elders Conference among us. having for its object our union in matters of doctrine and sentiment, and purity from all bickerings, jealousies, or content to s, which might arise moog us, and mar our work in the Lort; and also to enable us to aid each other in the removal of al trials which may arise be ween preachers and churches, as well as to enable us n a judic ous manner to exercise proper discip inary care toward each other in all matters which may require it. And we do so emply covenant to set before our people an example of truth, in the inviolable fulfilment of the rules of this Conference, to the full st extent which God may place in our power.

I. This Conference shall be composed only of ordained E'ders and Licenciates in full and regular standing with the General Conference of Free Christian Baptists of New Brunswick, and it shall bear the

name of the Elders Conference of Free Ch istian Baptists.

II. The officers of this Conference shall be a Moderator and Secretary; the former to be appointed annually, and to continue during the year; the latter to continue during the pleasure of the conference.

III. The duties of the Modera or shall be to preside in all meetings; to preserve order; and to appoint special meetings when necessary. The duties of the Secretary shall be to keep a faithful and true record of all meeting , record all reports cor e pond on matters connected with the Conference, and give notice for meetings by the direction of
