UNITED STATES.

Liverpool Women and Cottages.  
Mr. Mark M. Pomeroy says of Liverpool, in his latest paper on his European ramblings:  
More in Liverpool than in New York, or any American city, are women to be found as clerks. They are in stores of all kinds, from the elegant millinery establishment to the huckster shop. We find them as proprietors and clerks in hotels, in charge of parcell and waiting rooms at depots, as ticket takers in places of amusement; in hardware stores, book stores, restaurants and other public places, busily engaged earning their living and adding not only to their own families but to the welfare of the country.

At the hotel where we had rooms the business office was in charge of stout, rosy-cheeked young women. At-night we noticed that a middle aged lady went about gathering into a tin box the gold and silver results of the day and that she locked the money in a safe, gave orders to male and female help and exercised authority in an unmistakable manner.

Our experience in England led us to think that women make better hotel-keepers than do men. They are not so scoldable when it comes to smoking, splitting tobacco juice and entertaining a lot of "boys" with snuffy stories as is the custom in many American hotels, but they keep the house in better order and look out for the pennies that make the pounds and thus all the personal property in a hotel is better cared for than is generally the case where men have the financial routine of hotel care and keeping on their masculine hands.
