TRADE NOTES.

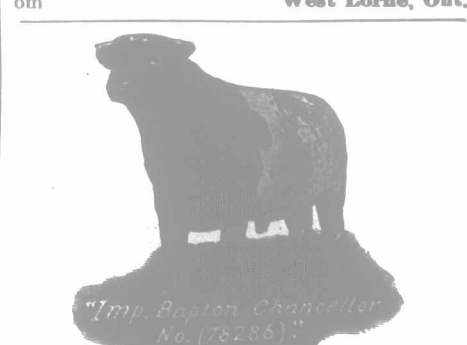
