

INTITULED

An Act to empower the Legislature of Canada to alter the Constitution of the Legislative Council for that Province.

HEREAS an Act of the Session of Parliament beden in the Third and Fourth Years of Her Majesty, Chapter Thirty-five, "to reunite the Provinces of Upper and Lower " Canada, and for the Government of Canada," provides amongst 5 other things for the Establishment of a Legislative Council in the Province of Canada, consisting of Members summoned thereto by the Governor, under the Authority of Her Majesty as therein specified: And whereas it is expedient that the Legislature of the said Province should be empowered to alter the Constitution of the said Legislative 10 Council: And whereas the said Act requires Amendment in other respect: Be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

I. It shall be lawful for the Legislature of Canada by any Act or Power to Acts to be hereafter for that Purpose passed, to alter the Manner of lature of composing the Legislative Council of the said Province, and to make Canada to it consist of such Number of Members appointed or to be appointed Constitution (137.)
