

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

NOTICE is hereby given, that HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations for the Inland Navigation of this Province, and for carrying of Goods Coastwise and for other purposes, under the authority of the Act passed in the 10th & 11th years of the Reign of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, intituled *An Act for repealing and consolidating the present Duties of Customs of this Province, and for other purposes therein mentioned*, and of an Act for amending the same.

REGULATIONS.

Section 1. — Be it ordered, That the Collector or proper Officer of Customs at any *Port of Entry* shall receive entries of the following Goods, that is to say : Grain, Flour or Meal, Beef or Pork, and Wood or Staves for Exportation within such time as may be agreed upon, not exceeding Six Calendar Months, under Bond, [which Bond may be taken by the Collector at the Port of Entry, or by the Collector at the place of Export, as may best suit the convenience of the parties interested] to the satisfaction of such Officer, in double the amount of the duty which would otherwise be chargeable on such Goods, and if such bond shall have been given at the place of Export, a Certificate thereof under the hand of the Collector or proper Officer of Customs, shall at the time of entering such Goods be produced to the Collector at the Port of Entry.

Certain Goods may be introduced into this Province, for Exportation without the payment of duty, and without being warehoused.

Section 2. — And be it further ordered, That the Collector or proper Officer of Customs at any Port at which Goods may have been entered for Exportation, shall grant to the party entering such Goods a Certificate under his hand, containing a full and particular statement in detail of such Goods, when and from where, and by what vessel imported, the amount of and names of sureties, contained in the Bond, which Certificate must be deposited with the Collector of the Port from which the Goods are to be finally shipped with the outward entry : and the Collector

Certificate of Bond being taken to be granted.
