*Expenses of Elections.*

AUDIT OFFICE,

SIR,—In order to enable me to authorize payment of your fees and expenses under Section 126 of Elections Act of 1874 and its amendment of 1878, I shall require you to send me the accounts as rendered to you :

1. Of the Constable, if any.
2. Of Printer for printing proclamation.
3. do do ballot papers, directions for guidance of voters, and other disbursements absolutely required.
4. Account for rent of building for nomination (if any) when public one not available.
5. Account for ballot boxes, if any.
6. do any special item.
7. Each Deputy Returning Officer's Account properly made out, and supported by account for rent of polling stations, and compartment or screen.
8. Your own account properly made out, with above supports.

The undersigned has the honor to submit to the Honourable the Treasury Board, that in his opinion the 30th Section of the Audit Act requires a uniform mode of issuing letters of credit for expenditure in all the Provinces.
