A Charge of Affected Animals Received at Chicago, Pa.—Horses Suffering From Glanders—Why the State of Things Was Not Discussed Sooner.

CHICAGO, Sept. 28.—The State Veterinarian yesterday killed two glandered horses in this city. The opinion among veterinarians and distillers becomes stronger daily that the disease now afflicting some of the quarantined cattle has been prevailing to a greater or less degree for some time. The theory that the distillers have attributed the diseased condition of the lungs to the hot slope on which the cattle are kept.

Mr. Salmon said it was doubtful whether the disease would be prevented from spreading over all the cattle in quarantine were killed, as the evidence so far obtained tended to show that the disease is not contagious.
