tion of a particular kind of world," ccording to Dr. Mandel.

The interbellum period of this century gave birth to many reflec-tions of this "world." "The familiar phantom of our age" (the zeitgeist?) is one reason for the popularity of Mickey Spillane AND Greene.

The paradoxes of Greene's work are many. The thriller both reflects and contrasts the reality of the age. It provides an opportunity for very sharp ironies. Good is Bad. The vicious murderer becomes sympathetic. But the bad is still bad, good still good.

"Man is a paradoxical thing in a world of paradoxes into which the intellect cannot bring order," he


The "theological thrillers" are concerned with the mystery of God's grace. Greene defines difference between man and God in both naturalistic and spiritual terms. He delineates "the awful


