

Winter Carnival in danger of 'not happening'

Winter Carnival desperately needs a chairman, assistant comptroller Rod Doherty reported to last Monday's regular Student Representative Council meeting. The former chairman has resigned and his replacement will need at least four weeks before Christmas to get things in order. There will be no Fall Festival

this year as the chairman resigned and no replacement could be found. This event was slated for the end of October, and there is not time to organize it now.

It was reported that the Administrative Board wants the student union to spend less money to send people to conferences and more to bring speakers to campus. Doherty said only a few students benefit from conferences, while the

whole campus can benefit from a speakers program.

Comptroller Wenceslaus Batanyita recommended that poll workers at student elections other than council members should be paid. However, this was not accepted. Instead, council decided to ask student union funded organizations to provide poll workers. Council will then give extra funds to the executives of

those societies by giving the minimum wage for everyone who works. This money would be spent how the society wanted, including paying the poll workers. Damian Bone was the only councillor to vote against this.

The Administrative Board minutes passed unanimously.

Vice-president Gary Stairs reported that senior citizens day is progressing well. The nursing and engineering society are working on projects to raise money for the United Way Campaign. Stairs said he is still working on the housing survey. Several consultations were accepted.

Travel Office services now open for students

After organizational delays, the Travel office is now open in room 3 of the SUB. Present hours are Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 3:30 to 5:00 and on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 11:30 to 4:30. In the near future, when the travel office gets settled, it is hoped that it will maintain regular business hours.

The office provides for students; travel information in the form of pamphlets and travel folders, International student ID cards (\$2.00), International Hostel Cards (\$10.00), Eurail passes and complete booking services. Students can pick up their tickets and have all hotel, motel and

airline reservations confirmed, without charge. The students get all of these services for the same price they would pay at the airport terminal.

Run this year by business students, the Travel office pays its expenses with reimbursements from Air Canada and the other organizations it deals with. In its association with J.D. Allingham, the travel office of late has been able to send people as far as Japan and Australia, with complete satisfaction.

Looking to the future, it is hoped that the travel office will be arranging group tours and charters for the various social organizations on campus.
