## THE UNB FILM SOCIETY

- Oct. 13-14 **THE LADYKILLERS**. In this black farce the evil plots of Alec Guinness and his sinister gang are constantly thwarted by the innocence and decency of an elderly lady.
- Oct. 20-21 **PALLINE AT THE BEACH**. A bedroom comedy transposed to the beaches of Normandy, this study of bourgeois manners and mores is replete with sun, sand, and sexual deception.
- Oct. 27-28 **INVASION OF THE BODY SNATCHERS**. This unusually subtle science-fiction film depicts the infiltration of a typical American town by aliens—a powerful political metaphor for the McCarthy era.
- Nov. 3-4 **SABOTAGE**. Based on Conrad's Secret Agent, this brooding story of a London anarchist contains some of Hitchcock's most masterful sequences.
- Nov. 10-11 **SHERLOCK JR. and THE THREE AGES**. In Sherlock Jr., Keaton, playing a young projectionist trapped inside a film, is drawn into a series of breathtakingly complicated stunts and effects. The Three Ages, a parody of Griffith's Intolerance, depicts the trials of courtship through the years, combining stories set in the stone age, in ancient Rome, and in modern America.
- Nov. 17-18 **THE SEVENTH SEAL**. Bergman's brilliant evocation of the Middle Ages follows the fortunes of a medieval knight engaged in a losing chess match with Death.
- Nov. 24-25 **THE ENIGMA OF KOPFERHAUSER**. In Herzog's bizarre exploration of human society, a young man who has been locked in a cellar since birth suddenly appears in a small German town in the early 19th century.
- Dec. 1-2 **BARRY LYNDON**. A shallow, parasitic opportunist, Lyndon (Ryan O'Neal) schemes his way through the upheavals of 18th century England and Europe.
