At approximately 1030 hours, while flying three plane formation, Harvard IIB, FE757 broke away from formation without signal in snowstorm and disappeared downward near Penetanguishine, Ontario. The Pilot, Lieutenant W.D. King, a student pilot on Course 92, was killed. Categorized A.

At about 1230 hours, Harvard IIB, FE403, struck ground in snowstorm at Camp Borden, Ontario. The pilot, R.207349 LAC Normandin, P.J., was killed. Categorized A.

A motion picture was shown in the theatre at 1800 and 2000 hours.

Edenvale:- No flying. Course 90 reported from main aerodrome.

The Station Band provided music at this function and all Air Cadet Liaison Officers from Camp Borden were present.
