

Ottawa, 26th Mar., 1903.

Sir,-

Enclosed herewith is a copy of a letter from Chief Tinass of the Red Bank Band relating to the small tracts of land which were to ^{be} laid off as a sugar bush for the use of the Indians in their reserve. I shall feel obliged if you will send me your report thereon.

In this connection I beg to draw your attention to my letter of the 4th October last, and to ask you to be good enough to ascertain and inform me why the survey therein referred to has not been performed by Mr. Donal McMillan, Deputy Surveyor, River Charles, in accordance with instructions sent to him on the same date.

Mr. McMillan was instructed to confer with you as to the lines which required to be surveyed in the reserve.
