Sir,

You will remember that Mr. Bray informed you that you would probably be instructed to finally conclude the arrangement of the land matters of the Thunderchild and Moosemin Bands and for this purpose you consulted the files of the Department. I have now to request you to be good enough to go carefully into this matter on your return from the Peace River country and make the final selection of the lands still requiring to be defined under the agreement made with these bands on the surrender of their old reserves. Should you require any further information in the matter please apply for it.

In this connection I have to inform you that Sections 1 and 12, Township 52, Range 16, W-3-M, were set apart and are still held for the Moosemin and Thunderchild bands. A settler, Chester Kellogg, has been squatted on the fractional South East  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the said Section 1 for the past six years and has gone extensively into the ranching business. It is desired to allow Mr. Kellogg to acquire possession of certain fractional portions of the said sections 1 and 12, provided it is not necessary
