I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 14th instant, in which you state that on the 12th ultimo you referred again to the treatment for tuberculosis cases at the Qu'Appelle school, which arose out of Dr. Hall's report for the month of March, to which you draw attention on the 15th of April, and that you would be pleased to hear from the Department in this connection.

In reply I beg to say that in his report for the month of March, last, Dr. Hall reported that one girl had tuberculosis, and, as you were informed in official letter of the 1st of May, last, the Principal was instructed to discharge this girl. The Department was advised by the Principal on the 12th ultimo that this girl, Mabel Paul, died on the 3th of April.

If there are at present any cases of tuberculosis in the school the doctor should report them.
