thrown out of employment. The state owes it to the people to see that some provision is made as a matter of right to those who spent their years in toil to see they are not left in penury in old age.

As part of the plan that I have spoken of tonight, if we could make agreements with the different provinces, we are prepared to go farther whereby the age limit will be made less than it is today and the amount of the pension will be bigger, but that will have to be done in conjunction with the provinces.

I could speak on other things in the nature of reform but I think I have indicated enough to show you that this government realizes that we are in a period of transition and this world will not countenance millionaires and poverty side by side. We owe to our day and generation to see that kind of thing is stopped. People are looking at things differently and when a man can spend his life in idleness and away from his own country and others not able to work, there is something wrong.

If these measures are to be put on the statutes and kept there there will have to be a public opinion back of them which will see they are maintained. A government that is not representing all the provinces of our country cannot begin to achieve the reforms which a government which represents all the different parts of the country, could carry out.

As regards the results of the Ontario election, what do these results show? They show very clearly that here is a government that has been returned by a large majority that has only 45 per cent of the votes of the province as against 55 per cent. It is the greatest object lesson that this nation can have before it.

Ask yourselves, ladies and gentlemen, what particular party in Canada today is able to command a following in every province of the Dominion and is going to be possible for any party other than the party in office today to carry on the government of the country?

Take the Province of Alberta. We have in Parliament a group of Social Crediters. Do you think they will be able to form a government? They are only in that one province. They can do nothing. It is a run between Social Crediters and Liberals in Alberta. Through the provinces of Saskatchewan and Manitoba do you think the Tory party will sweep that country?
