loss of money and a cigarette lighter by Trooper McLennan, is that correct?

A-274 Yes, sir.

Q-275 Will you look at the accused, do you recognize him?

A-275 Trooper Adams, C.P. of Headquarters Squadron.

Q-276 In the course of your investigation did you have occasion to interview the accused?

A-276 I did.

Q-277 Did you interview him in the afternoon?

A-277 I did.

Q-278 At that time was any statement made to you by the accused?

A-278 There was.

BY THE PROSECUTOR: May I ask now if the Defending Officer objects to the voluntary nature of the statement made by the accused.

BY THE DEFENDING OFFICER: Mr. President and Judge Advocate, and Members of the Court, I object.

(ON ISSUE) EXAMINED BY THE PROSECUTOR: (on the issue)

Q-279 Had you had any interview with the accused prior to the afternoon?

A-279 I had, in the morning.

Q-280 Where had the interview taken place in the morning?

A-280 Headquarters Squadron office.

Q-281 Who was present at that time?

A-281 Mr. Wood and Sergeant-major Fougere.

Q-282 Was Lieutenant Wood the Orderly Officer of the day?

A-282 Yes, sir.

Q-283 Did the accused make a statement to you at that time?

A-283 He did.

Q-284 Was he cautioned at that time?

A-284 Not in the proper method, which I found out later.

Q-285 Was any inducement made to the accused in the morning to make a statement?
