I proceeded on a short weekend leave from which I did not return until approximately 0900 hours 8 Jan 45. To the best of my knowledge no unauthorized persons were in the room

A- I imagine I must have gone in the room where the safe was kept to pick up my bag. I always hang my bag up in there.

"I am employed as pay clerk on the ledgers in the Pay Office of T. & S. Wing, A-33 C.A.C.T.E., G.A., and have been since 15 Jan 45. On 5 Jan 45 I left the Pay Office at 1145 hours to proceed on weekend leave. I left on the 1215 hours train and proceeded to Toronto and remained there until I returned at approximately 0945 hours Monday, 8 Jan 45. I was not in the Pay Office between the time I left on 5 Jan and the time I reported for duty at 0800 hours on 18 Jan 45. I did not have any keys to the Pay Office either for the outer doors or for the inner door to the room where the safe is kept. I did not know the combination of the safe nor did I have a key to the cash box. I did not know where the keys to the cash box were kept."
