

The timber limit or berth covered by this Licence No. 266 comprises the following lands:— The southerly part of Chemainus I.R. No. 13 - 1612 acres, less a parcel on the southwest boundary, and two parcels on the south boundary, which three parcels comprise 238 acres, and are shown on Indian Affairs Plan B.C. 210 and on a topographical map by Eustace Smith dated Feb. 1920; the remaining area under this license being 1374 acres.

Royalties payable:—

- (a) \$1 per thousand feet board measure on all timber suitable for saw-logs, boom-sticks, etc., scaled under the British Columbia log rule.
- (b) 75 cents per cord of 128 cubic feet on all timber suitable for shingle bolts, pulp-wood, cordwood or other woods customarily measured by the cord.
- (c) 2 cents per lineal foot on all timber suitable for piling, poles and spars.
- (d) 5 cents per tie and 3 cents per post.

Stumpage payable:— including royalties

Fir and Cedar, all grades - \$3.50 per M.  
Hemlock & Balsam, all grades 2.25 per M.  
Alder and maple, all grades 2.50 per M.

This licence No. 266 renewable yearly, under the provisions of section No. 13 of the Regulations governing the disposal of timber on Indian Reserves in the province of British Columbia, for a period of one year until April 30, 1949.

Timber-mark to be placed on timber cut under authority of this Licence No. 266

thus:— I.R. and any other mark allotted by the Forest Branch Department of Lands, Victoria, B. C.

The licensee may operate a portable saw mill on the Reserve, providing that mill debris is disposed of to the satisfaction of the Provincial Forest Service.
