Sir, -  
I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 13th August.

In reply, I beg to inform you that all Indian Agents were furnished with copies of the game regulations last year. This year every Indian Agent has been sent a copy of the "Game Act". I am also sending them copies of the open seasons. I may, however, say that while I sent these papers to the Indian Agents I do not think one of them ever troubled to make an acknowledgment of them, and I am of the opinion that, with possibly one or two exceptions, when they get them they do not take the trouble to inform the Indians of their contents. I believe that Mr. Galbraith is an exception however.

I also wish to say that I shall be pleased to send copies of the open seasons for game to the principal Indian Chiefs themselves if I could get a list of them.
