Attempts were made in 1909 to open a day school at the head of Okanagan Lakes and in 1910 at Penticton and EndSby. The scheme was carried so far at EndSby that donks AND SEats were predered purchased by the Department and placed and placed in the old church building.

I sheelutely condemn day schools for the children of this band at their present state of civilation for many reasons high I can advance. The only true solution of the question . I consider, would be the establishment of an Indrustrial School espable of accommodating 150 cheldren under Coversmant control at Thitemans Creek, on the west side of Okanagan Lake. Two or three hundred acres of land should be not spart from the remerve for this purpose.

In the Kamlcops Agency there are 350 children within the school age. Kamlcops Indfustial School has an attendance of 64 children from this Agency SE boys 31 girls. This is all that can be accommented in this institution.

These buildings are of wood and old; though a consider able amount readently has been spent on them by the Department in receive. To solve the education problem for the children of this Agency, I consider new modern buildings, capable of accommodating at least 200 children, should be exected at an early date, and more cultivable land should be found so that dairing and other necessary indjustries could be practically taught the children.

POWER OF CELEFS.

I observed that during our tour of inspection and invest igntion several of the Indians Chief asked for some power so as to control evil inclined Indians on the reserves. I think there requests are reasonable and should get favourable consideration . Section 98 of the Indian Act provides that Chiefs of an y band in council may make rules and regulations at the carrying out of certain reforms and order on the reserves subject to confirmation by the Governor 12 Council. Up to the present this section has been a dead eletter
