## The Organization of the Department

### GENERAL POWERS.

The Discipline (par. 337) defines the general powers of the General Conference Board of Temperance, Prohibition and Moral Reform as follows:—"The Board shall have general oversight of our Temperance, Prohibition and Moral Reform work throughout the Church, and shall have authority to make representations to governments, legislatures, and parliament in harmony with the declared principles and policy of the General Conference on all matters of legislation and administration which affect Temperance, Prohibition and Moral Reform."

Further specific powers are granted in the same paragraph to publish and circulate literature; co-operate with other bodies engaged in similar work; appoint Field Secretaries and define their duties; employ or authorize to act as specialists in moral and social reform work, etc., etc.

The Board is further empowered by General Conference (Journal, 1910, page 412) "to give as much practical effect as possible to the recommendations and principles embodied" in the report of the General Conference Committee on Sociology.

### DETAILS OF ORGANIZATION.

The General Board is composed of the General Superintendents, the General Secretary, the Field Secretaries, the Treasurer, and seventy-six other members, one-half elected by General Conference for four years, and one-half elected annually by the Annual Conferences. (Disc., par. 336.)
