

to give their names or occupations, although assured that doing so would not in any way injure them, might benefit them, and at all events would not cost them anything.

Notwithstanding these drawbacks, it will be seen that the present work contains a *properly arranged ALPHABETICAL DIRECTORY*, extending to the 141st page, in which there are about FOUR THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED NAMES.

The second part of the work gives a CLASSIFIED DIRECTORY of the principal professional and business persons, arranged under their proper heads, (*a feature altogether new in a Quebec Directory*;) and the third Part gives a GENERAL DIRECTORY to all Public Institutions, and Public Offices, together with an ALPHABETICAL GUIDE TO THE STREETS OF THE CITY, and such other miscellaneous information as may be interesting or useful to the Public.

The General Index to the work will be found of considerable value, as saving time in looking up any desired information, and, taken altogether, the editor trusts that the present Directory will be found essentially useful to the Community.
